

DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE RECOVERY ACT REPORTING REQUIREMENTS AND WEBINAR

As the Department of Justice continues to award grants through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, it is committed to providing detailed reports on the funded projects and activities. When published on www.RecoveryAct.gov, these reports will offer the public an unprecedented level of transparency into how Federal dollars are being spent and will help drive accountability for the timely, prudent, and effective spending of recovery funds.

Grant recipient reports required by the Recovery Act will answer important questions, such as:

- Who is receiving Recovery Act dollars and in what amounts?
- What projects or activities are being funded with Recovery Act dollars?
- What is the completion status of such projects or activities and what impact have they had on job creation and retention?

Recovery Act grantees will submit information through www.FederalReporting.gov. **The initial reports are due on October 10, 2009, with subsequent reports due on the 10th day of each quarter.**

The Department's Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Office on Violence against Women and the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services hosted a webinar on the Recovery Act reporting requirements on Thursday, September 10, 2009. The webinar is available on the [OJP Recovery Act website](#).
